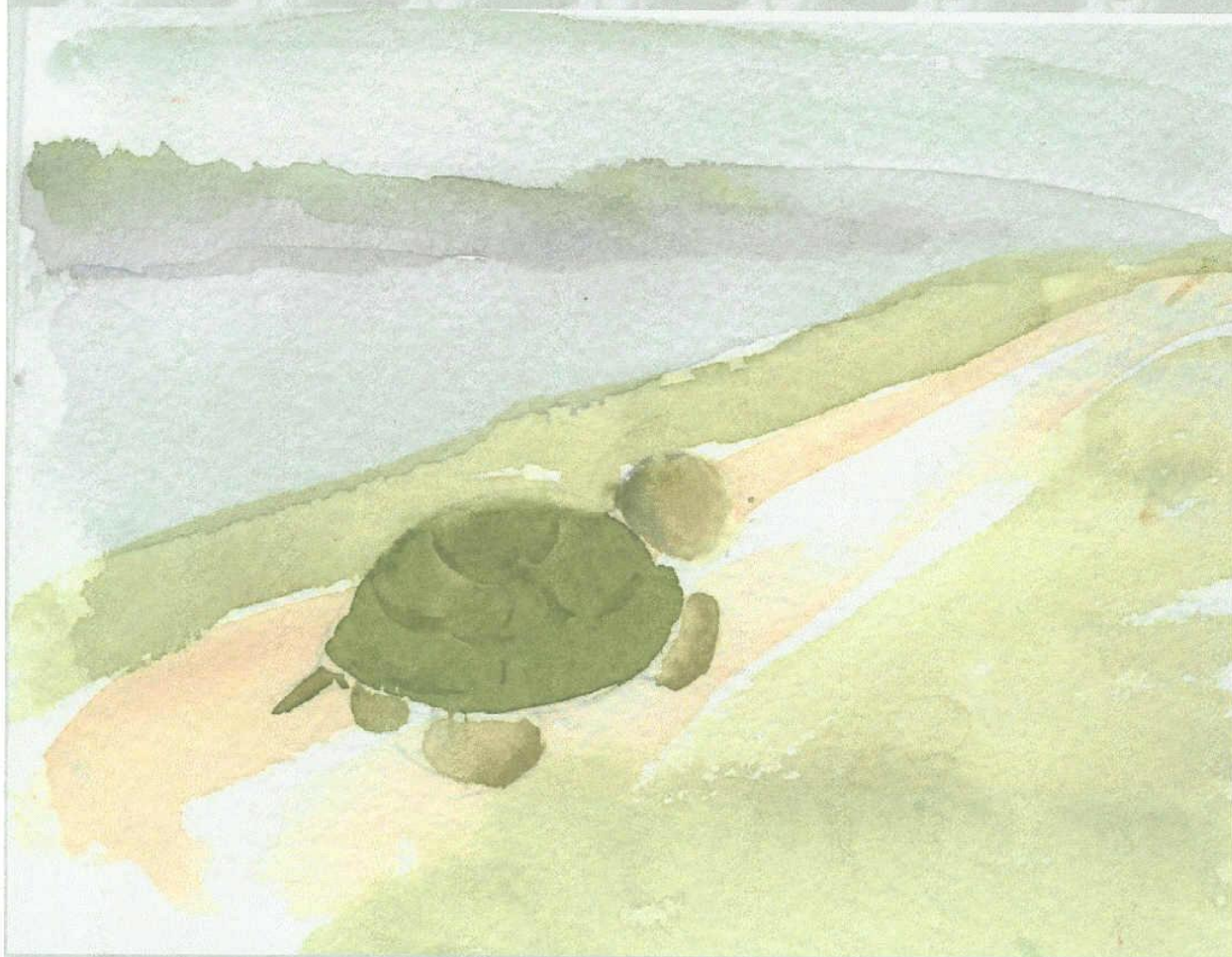


# The Turtle Tale
